FIRST READING: Acts 2:42-47

In response to Peter's sermon on the day of Pentecost, 3000 people were baptized and formed a new community of believers in Jerusalem.

⁴²They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.

⁴³ Awe came upon everyone, because many wonders and signs were being done by the apostles. ⁴⁴All who believed were together and had all things in common; ⁴⁵they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. ⁴⁶Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, ⁴⁷praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. GOSPEL: John 10:1-10

For a thousand years, the Gospel reading for this Sunday has been from John 10. While usually this reading includes Jesus describing himself as the Good Shepherd, this year he uses a different image from sheepherding to describe his ministry.

- P The Holy Gospel according to St. John the 10th chapter.
- C Glory to you, O Lord.

Very truly, I tell you, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold by the gate but climbs in by another way is a thief and a bandit. 2 The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. 3The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep hear his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. 4When he has brought out all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice. 5They will not follow a stranger, but they will run from him because they do not know the voice of strangers.' 6 Jesus used this figure of speech with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them.

7 So again Jesus said to them, 'Very truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. 8All who came before me are thieves and bandits; but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. 10The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly.

About today's hymns:

Appropriately for "Good Shepherd Sunday," one of this today's hymns mentions sheep and shepherd, while the others are paraphrases of Psalm 23.

"Christ the Lord is Risen Today" is the latest (so far) step in a progression of a single tune and text through ten centuries and at least three languages. It started life as "*Victimae Paschali Laudet*," a sort of sung Easter pageant, with parts for the disciples, Mary Magdalene, and a crowd; we've got it as "Christians, to cthe Paschal Victim" in both *ELW* and *LBW*. Later it was re-worked into a German carol (a sung dance), "*Christ ist Erstanden*," which we still sing as "Christ Is Arisen." Luther got his hands on it and turned it into a chorale, "*Christ Lag in Todesbanden*," which in English is "Christ Jesus Lay in Death's Strong Bands." Finally, Jane Leeson, an English Victorian, went back to the original and turned it into the straightforward hymn we'll be singing today.

"The King of Love My Shepherd Is" is a freer, but still close paraphrase of the psalm, which preserves much of its wording while adding some very memorable phrases of its own ("transport of delight" and "perverse and foolish oft I strayed," for instance). The tune is based on an Irish folk song collected in the early 19th century, but was reworked significantly, probably by Ralph Vaughn Williams, adding the unusual and delightful triplets. The tune is named for St. Columba, the Irish monk who brought Christianity to Scotland.
