#### **COME, HOLY SPIRIT, COME!**



The Holy Scriptures depict God's Spirit in a variety of ways. In Genesis the Spirit moves across the waters at the dawn of creation. The angel Gabriel informs Mary that the Holy Spirit will come upon her and the power of the Most High will overshadow her to accomplish the birth of God's Son, Jesus. At our Lord's baptism the Spirit descends upon him in the form of a dove. Jesus described the Spirit as a Paraclete, an advocate, who would be with his followers after he was gone. After his resurrection Christ exhorts his disciples to go and make disciples of all nations baptizing them in the Triune name of God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. In Acts the Spirit comes to the early church in a rush of wind and in tongues of fire. The Spirit enables them to speak in other languages. They Spirit grants them understanding even as they speak of God's deeds of power in different languages they hear one another in their own native languages. The Spirit unites them on that first Pentecost Day in their mission to share the

Gospel. Paul notes that the Spirit is at work in our lives bearing fruit. The fruits of the Holy Spirt listed in the book of Galatians include love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control. The activity, presence, and impact of the Holy Spirt is significant. In faith we trust that God's Spirit is at work in the world and in our lives. It creates and nurtures our faith. It inspires us to faithful service, discipleship and to share God's good news. It moves in and through all creation throughout time and space cultivating peace, justice, and love.

Each Pentecost Sunday the church celebrates God's gift of the Holy Spirit. This year that is Sunday, May 19. We invite worshippers to wear red that day. Consider sponsoring a geranium (which you can take home after worship) to help decorate the sanctuary. The Pentecost account from Acts 2:1-21 accounts how the early church heard of God's deeds of power all in their own languages. Once again, this year the Scripture readings will be read in several global languages and please contact me if you are interested in helping with the readings that day.

We see the Holy Spirit at work at Christ Lutheran. This May and June we will receive new members and we look forward to officially welcoming them to this faith community. We rejoice and give thanks to God for the many gifts, talents, energy, and skills they have brought and continue to bring to congregational life.

On Pentecost Sunday we will recognize our congregation's high school graduates. These students have enriched our community of faith and the wider community throughout their lives. In 2019 many in this group of seniors were part of the largest confirmation class at Christ Lutheran since 1876. As they prepare for new endeavors, we will pray for them asking for God's Spirit to guide and be present with them.

The Spirit's work is visible as the congregation council has been leaning into a strategic planning process to offer direction and focus for the congregation as we move forward into the future. I see God's Spirit at work as the congregation gathers to worship, sing and ring, learn, and serve. The fruits of the Spirit that you each share makes a difference in our community of faith and in the lives of those in need here and around the world.

This month as we reflect on the work and presence of God's Holy Spirit, may that Spirit deepen your faith and inspire you to offer your Spirit-given gifts in service to God and others. Come Holy Spirit Come!
